Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be in the 9th grade or above to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in April. Confirmation will take place in May.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

It's that time of year again for my annual reminder that it is not a sin to miss Mass if you are sick. Missing Mass is serious business, so don't get me wrong here. God has done so much for us, and it is important that we thank him the way he wants to be thanked. He has commanded us to give him thanks and praise by offering the Eucharist, and to not give him thanks for what he has done for us is an injustice. When we are children, our parents taught us to say thank you and this especially applies to thanking God for the good things he has done for us.

That being said, missing Mass is permissible if you are sick. I want to be clear. You did not commit a "mortal sin" if your health challenges made it too difficult for you to attend. But there is another dimension to being ill, and that is that if you are contagious you should not attend Mass because you should not want to get other people sick. Yes, you must have the right intention. Your intention can't be to miss Mass, but to protect other people from becoming ill.

I was recently reminded by a parishioner how serious this is for some people. I think some people might just go to Mass if they have a cold thinking, "Big deal. It's just a cold and these people can tough it out." Well, believe it or not, even a common cold can become a huge health issue for somebody who has a problem with their immune system. We have people on chemotherapy in our parishes, for example, and a cold can cause them serious difficulties. Also, elderly people can develop pneumonia from a bug that other people can shake off with ease.

Let me be clear. You should not attend Mass if you are sick and are contagious. It is not a mortal sin if you do miss Mass under these circumstances. Yes, Mass is serious – more serious than you probably realize and missing it for a bad reason will hurt your relationship with God whether you know it or not. But this simply does not apply to a person whose circumstances include being sick. As I explained, as long as the intention is to protect the health of your fellow parishioners, missing Mass because you are sick is not a sin.

If you are sick, I encourage you to stay home. If you still feel like you should do something to express your gratitude to God, then there are certainly some things you can do. If you miss Mass because you are ill I want to encourage you to take an hour for personal prayer at home. Offer a rosary. Read a chapter of a book by a saint. Watch some Catholic Content on the internet. Fr. Mike Schmitz has some great videos on YouTube you can watch. You can also view content on Formed.org (our parish code is still FTFWEZ).

Furthermore, if you are a lector or an extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, do not attempt to do your ministry while you are sick. Trust me, we will find somebody else to step in if we need to. Yes, its preferred that you call us if you cannot serve, because you are sick or because of any other reason. While we are grateful for the service you give to our parish, there are other people who can step in and help if we need. So please don't feel bad if you have to step back to recover your health.


