# **Sacrament Information**

**Infant Baptism:** A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

**First Reconciliation & First Eucharist:** Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

**Confirmation:** Candidates must be in the 9th grade or above to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in April. Confirmation will take place in May.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

**Anointing of the Sick:** Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

## Dear Parishioners,

I'm still dealing with a bad case of what I assume is writers block. I've always enjoyed writing these columns, but lately I just don't feel up to it. My thoughts just aren't there and it's been a bit frustrating. I can think of things to write about, but the words I type just don't do the subjects justice including this one. I wish I could get the thoughts in my head on paper, but I just can't seem to do it! (It doesn't help that a new company has taken over our bulletin and changed my deadline)

Last week I went to go see *A Beautiful Day in the Neighborhood,* the latest movie about the famous children's television personality, Mr. Rogers. I didn't grow up liking Mr. Rogers all that much but I did watch his show and I absolutely loved this movie and think it is one that everyone needs to see. It was just a wonderful movie and it brought up many important themes for reflection.

In terms of style, the movie was filmed like an episode of Mr. Rogers Neighborhood. It began with the classic song we all know and began with Mr. Rogers (played by Tom Hanks) speaking about a friend of his named Lloyd who needed to forgive somebody. Lloyd was a journalist who wrote for Esquire Magazine, and he had a reputation for tearing his subjects apart. The movie is about how Fred Rogers helped him to forgive and to deal with his anger.

That is a pretty simplistic description of the movie and it might sound a little cheesy (this is Mr. Rogers we're talking about) but the point of the whole thing is how important Mr. Rogers was and how even adults need him. I've been thinking about my own upbringing and how different it is from what I see in kids today and I believe Mr. Rogers may have had more of an impact on me than I thought.

Mr. Rogers talked to children about important things. He talked about death and divorce and war and other things most adults are afraid to talk to kids about. He acknowledged that its ok to be sad and that not everything is always going to work out the way we want. This is an important message children and adults need to-day... only nobody is actually saying it. Instead, the message is that if you're not happy all the time there is something wrong with you.

I spoke with one of our teachers about the movie, and she made a good point about Mr. Rogers. She said that when she was a kid, Mr. Rogers was really one of just a few shows for kids. By the time I was a kid, however, there were already many options and Mr. Rogers likely losing viewers to other shows. I think it is possible that we are seeing the effect of his absence, as many young people my age and younger don't seem to have received the same messages previous generations received from him.

The film also did not shy away from showing Mr. Rogers' deep faith in God. An ordained Presbyterian minister, several times the movie showed him at prayer and asking for prayers from other people. Jesus informed Fred Roger's entire mission in life, and we can't downplay the impact Jesus had on our society through Mr. Rogers. I hope you'll see the movie and have some great conversations with your family and friends about the impact Mr. Rogers had, and whether or not children today have similar resources.



# 8 diciembre La Inmaculada Concepción de María

La Inmaculada Concepción, conocida también como la Puríma Concepción, es un dogma de la Iglesia católica decretado en 1854 que sostiene que la Virgen María estuvo libre del pecado original desde el primer momento de su concepción por los méritos de su hijo Jesucristo, recogiendo de esta manera el sentir de dos mil años de tradición Cristiana al respect.o.

La doctrina reafirma con la expresión «llena de gracia» contenida en el saludo del <u>Arcángel Gabriel</u> (Lc. 1,28), y recogida en la oración del <u>Ave María</u>, este aspecto de ser libre de pecado por la gracia de Dios.

La Imagen muestra el delicado pie de la Virgen pisando la serpiente. El Altísimo prometió a la mujer (Eva) que su linaje obtendría la Victoria sobre el malign y sus obras. Con gran fuerza la imagen, portnado al reconciliador en su seno, trae a nuestra mente el cumplimiento de esa promesa. (Gen.3,15)

El pie maternal de quien porta la Victoria expresa la cooperación de María a la redención del genero humano.



# San Juan Diego

Juan Diego Cuauhlatoatzin (Cuautitlán, 1474 - 1548), fue, según la tradición católica, un indígena chichimeca que presenció la aparición de la Virgen de Guadalupe en 1531.

Dice el Obispo Arizmendí, "el detalle tan amoroso de nuestra Madre, que no solo escoge a Juan Diego, expression de un pueblo pobre y oprimido, que se siente marginado, despreciado y sin esperanza. Nuestra Virgen de Guadalupe con un amor le habla a Juan Diego en su propio idioma, el náhuatl.

Después de la construcción de la ermita, San Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin vivió allí por el resto de sus días custodiando el ayate y compartiendo su experiencia a todos los visitantes.

# Did you know? Another way to give...

## **Qualified Charitable Distributions**

The 2017 Tax Act created higher standard deduction amounts, making it more difficult for taxpayers to itemize deductions, which include charitable deductions. Since many taxpayers will continue making charitable gifts that may not provide them with any financial benefit, it's important to rethink charitable gifts.

## **Hypothetical:**

- Individual has a \$10,000 required minimum distribution (RMD)
- Individual directs the IRA Custodian to distribute any amount of the RMD directly to their charity of choice
- Any amount distributed to a qualified charity counts toward RMD requirement
- Any amount distributed to a qualified charity is not included in taxable income
- Individual benefits by not paying income tax on the distribution, while also fully benefitting from the higher standard deduction amount

## **Rules:**

• Individual must have reached RMD age (70.5)
