Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be in the 9th grade or above to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in April. Confirmation will take place in May.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

A couple of weeks ago, Mrs. Cathy Strader, the principal of St. Rose school, resigned from her position which will go into effect at the end of the school year. It is obvious to me and anyone else who worked closely with Mrs. Strader that she loves our school and the students who attend. I know that this decision was not easy for her, but she believes that this opportunity is best for her family right now. I wish her the best of luck in her future and I am praying for her and her family during this time of transition which will certainly be sad and challenging in many ways.

Of course, this means that we will begin the process of hiring a new principal and that is now my highest priority as Pastor of our local parishes. St. Rose school is the largest ministry in our community and it is essential that we find an enthusiastic and committed person to lead our school into the future. I know that with your prayers we will be successful in finding a new principal for St. Rose School.

I have asked Kay Purcell to direct our search. As so many of you know, Kay is a former principal of St. Rose School herself and supports our school as much as anyone in our community. I know that her love of the school and her experience in Catholic education will make her a perfect person to guide this process.

Kay and I have already worked to post the position in several publications, and we will also be reaching out to people we know in Catholic education to invite them to apply. We are also well on the way of identifying a search team and, in fact, by the time you read this it is likely that that team will already be in place.

Our search team will be responsible for identifying the strongest needs for our school and identifying the best candidate for those needs. We have set an application deadline of March 20th for all interested candidates and we hope to have this process concluded and a new principal hired before Easter, which is April 12th.

“Levantemos el corazón. Lo tenemos levantado hacia el Señor”.

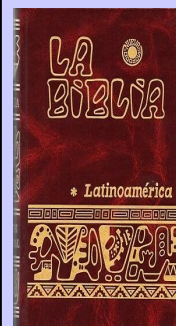
