Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be in the 9th grade or above to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in April. Confirmation will take place in May.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

There is a lot of concern among our fellow parishioners regarding the Corona Virus and if we are going to make any changes to our current practices at Mass. At the time of this writing (February 28, 2020), there have been no extra directives given by the Archdiocese. If that changes, we will certainly implement them.

In the meantime, I would like to remind people of current practices in place. One of the most important things to remember is that missing Mass because you are sick is not a sin. In fact, missing Mass because you are afraid of passing your illness on to other parishioners is an act of charity towards them. So, if you are ill and worried about spreading your germs, please stay home. You are not sinning.

In response to this, some people have said, "Father, I'm old school. I never miss Mass for any reason including sickness." Well, I don't want to sound too snarky here, but if you were really old school you'd listen to what your pastor is teaching you and not question his judgement on this. Seriously, if you think you are ill and you believe that you can spread your germs to others stay home. Going to Mass when you are ill and contagious is really more of a prideful thing than a humble acceptance of Church teaching.

As far as our practices at Mass, one thing that comes up is receiving communion from the cup. Please know that you are not under any obligation to receive from the cup. Choosing to abstain from the cup does not mean you are receiving less communion than anyone else in Church. It is simply one kind of reception. Receiving the precious body alone is as full of an experience of communion as receiving under both kinds.

Also, there is an odd belief among some people that you cannot get sick from receiving from the cup. Their belief is that because the wine in the cup has been changed into the blood of Christ it is impossible for any type of sickness to be spread through it. I won't go into the theology of Transubstantiation right now, but I will say that even if that was true, germs could still spread through the outside of the cup since many people touch it.

My point is that if you do not want to receive from the cup, do not receive. It really can spread germs.

Also, after we recite the Our Father, we offer each other a sign of peace which usually comes in the form of a handshake. Some people are, honestly, uncomfortable with this for reasons that include fear of spreading germs. Actually shaking hands during this part of the Mass is not the only way to offer a sign of peace. So, if anyone doesn't want to shake your hand at the sign of peace that's ok. You or anyone else is not obliged to do so.

As far as receiving on the tongue (again, at the time of this writing) there have been no directives about this from the Archdiocese, and those who prefer to receive on the tongue still have a right to do so. If that is what you would like to do you can continue, but in light of the present situation you might consider receiving on the hand. Still, it is your call and we will honor that.


