Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be in the 9th grade or above to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in April. Confirmation will take place in May.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

Lent begins this Wednesday, and I want to encourage you to make the most of it. Lent is a season where we become aware of our sins and our weaknesses so that we can come to rely more heavily on God. Part of the way that we grow in this is through making sacrifices.

One of these sacrifices we do as an entire Church, which is abstaining from meat on Fridays. There is nothing wrong with meat, but meat in many places around the world is considered to be a luxury. So, we abstain from it for the sake of simplicity. Some people spend their Fridays during Lent eating Lobster and salmon, and while this fulfills the letter of the law I don't believe it really fulfills the spirit of the law which is to be simple.

A great Lenten meal is grilled cheese and tomato soup, or a small simple piece of fish with a simple side or two. This really gets to the simplicity of lent. Of course, during Lent we also make a personal sacrifice where we give up something we enjoy. The purpose of this sacrifice is (as I've repeatedly said over the years) not to prove our strength. Nobody is impressed with your ability to give up chocolate. The purpose is to grow in our awareness of how weak we are.

I once heard a priest say that the purpose of fasting is to practice saying no to the pleasure that comes from good things, so we can be better at saying no to the pleasure that comes from sin. This is a really, really good summary of why we give something up for Lent. We say no to the pleasure that comes from good things, so we can resist sin.

Saying no to the pleasure that comes from sin is not just about resisting through our own efforts, or "white knuckling" it, as they say. It comes from learning to pray in the midst of temptation and to learn to rest in God's love. If we can learn to pray while tempted to enjoy things that aren't bad, we will be better at turning to prayer when we are tempted to do things we know are wrong.

This leads me to another popular Lenten devotion, which is the stations of the cross. Stations of the cross has been in decline for quite some time, and I would love to see a return to the stations of the cross. During the stations of the cross we meditate on the events leading up to Jesus' death. During these moments, Jesus did not turn away from God or his call to love others. He endured suffering and remained faithful.

Resisting sin and trusting in God can sometimes lead to suffering and lone-liness in the short term. Pondering Jesus' crucifixion and the love and fidelity he demonstrated can strengthen us and I want to strongly encourage you to partake of the Stations of the Cross at least one time this lent. All of our parishes have stations of the cross every Friday during Lent. Please ask around at your parish to find out when stations of the cross are held and please, do your best to attend one Friday during Lent.

If we do Lent right, we will experience greater joy and hope during Easter and we will become even bolder believers in the Lord's resurrection. We will experience in a much deeper way the joy and peace that we have knowing the Father raised Jesus from the dead.

IHM hosted FISH for three days on February 5-7 serving 255 people; this included 144 adults and 111 kids in 67 families for a total of 255 people.

Volunteers spent 100 hours preparing and distributing food this month. We will next serve FISH on April 2nd and 3rd. Our shelves are very bare after serving this month. To refill our pantry shelves we need more soup/stew/chili, lots of canned veggies, canned fruit, tuna, pasta and tomato sauce, Mac & Cheese, Top Ramen, rice (preferably in 1 pound packages or very large bags that can be divided into smaller bags), and pork n beans.

Please do not bring any fresh veggies or fruit until March 29th because we do not have refrigeration storage available.

Qualified Charitable Distributions

The 2017 Tax Act created higher standard deduction amounts, making it more difficult for taxpayers to itemize deductions, which include charitable deductions. Since many taxpayers will continue making charitable gifts that may not provide them with any financial benefit, it's important to rethink charitable gifts.

Hypothetical:

- Individual has a \$10,000 required minimum distribution (RMD)
- Individual directs the IRA Custodian to distribute any amount of the RMD directly to their charity of choice
- Any amount distributed to a qualified charity counts toward RMD requirement
- Any amount distributed to a qualified charity is not included in taxable income
- Individual benefits by not paying income tax on the distribution, while also fully benefitting from the higher standard deduction amount

Rules:

- Individual must have reached RMD age (70.5)
- Individual may make qualified charitable distributions in excess of their RMD amount, up to \$100,000/year.
