Sacrament Information

Infant Baptism: A preparation program for parents and godparents is required. Once paperwork is submitted, we will register you for preparation and schedule the date for Baptism.

First Reconciliation & First Eucharist: Customarily the reception of these sacraments takes place during 2nd grade. The child will need to have completed one year of religious education the year immediately prior to sacramental preparation and will continue in religious education concurrent with the preparation classes.

Confirmation: Candidates must be in the 9th grade or above to be confirmed. The candidate will need to have completed one year of youth group the year immediately prior to Confirmation preparation. They will also need to attend youth group the year of preparation. Preparation for adult Confirmation takes place in April. Confirmation will take place in May.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office at least six months in advance to begin the preparation process. You will set the date for the wedding at the first meeting.

Anointing of the Sick: Please contact the parish office to arrange visitation and sacraments. You may leave a message any time of day or night and someone will get back to you as soon as possible.

Dear Parishioners,

Last weekend the readings gave me an opportunity to talk about the important contributions that the elderly make to our local parishes and our world. For those who missed it, the elderly can speak words of peace and comfort to those who are young and fearful.

Fear is a serious issue. All throughout the Gospels, Jesus tells us, "Do not be afraid," but we don't quite understand why he says this and what it means for us. I always associated this with evangelization, as if Jesus was telling me not to be afraid to proclaim his way of life. That is part of it, to be sure, but Jesus' command is much stronger. He says we shouldn't let ourselves be afraid of anything.

For some reason, I found myself reflecting on my own fears and what they do to me. I have had many fears emerge in our parishes over the few years I've been here. I have been afraid with declining enrollment in the school. I have been afraid of disappointing people. I've been afraid of things not being perfect. Those fears have caused me to become very impulsive and reactive and I've rushed some decisions that, in retrospect, may have been wrong.

I've also seen fear cause a lot of really good people to act in very disappointing ways. I've seen angry outbursts caused by fear. I've seen rash decisions made out of fear. I've seen very harmful gossip emerge out of fear. Jesus tells us to love, and St. Paul reminds us that love is patient, kind, and that it does not brood over injury. Well, when people are fearful, we can't be any of those things. When we are fearful, we simply cannot love.

Young people are especially afraid of many things. We are taught to fear the end of the world because of things like climate change. We are taught to fear that if one person becomes president World War Three will begin, and if the other person becomes president we are all going to instantly become poor.

I don't want to downplay or dismiss the importance of any political issue, but our fear does go too far from time to time. We know that fear goes too far when we start to hate other people, and there is quite a lot of that out there right now. I bet that if you think of some of your worst moments or worst decisions you'll find there was fear involved. The same can be true of other people you may know.

This brings me back to the elderly. The older you are the more power you have to drive out fear in our midst, but this means that you must overcome your own fears. Don't fall for the lies we are presented with. You have seen doomsday prophets come and go over your lifetime. There have been countless people proclaiming the end of the world, and they've all been wrong.

There have been many issues that have come and gone over the years and even though they are important, they don't have to interfere with our relationships with our family and friends. You can draw on your experience and tell people that it isn't worth it to be afraid, especially when that fear causes us to hate others.

You can also proclaim how your faith leads you. Jesus understood how dangerous fear is and he denounced it. He also taught that love drives out fear, and his apostle John wrote a letter about just that! Our faith not only instructs us in how to love truly, but it actually helps us to tap into the very source of love itself, which is God. So please, proclaim that to all those who walk in the darkness of fear.




